

# Call goes out for help to clean up popular beach

A CALL has gone out to head down to Rossall Beach.

But residents are not being invited to enjoy the first rays of spring sun.

Instead a residents' group needs help to improve the appearance of the coastline.

Rossall Beach Residents Association is urging people to join in a big tidy up on Monday March 30.

Volunteers should meet at the Five Bar Gate near Rossall School at 9.30am for a briefing, with the clean

up taking place from 10am until 12.30pm.

Jane Littlewood, chairman of the group, said: "Regular readers of The Gazette will know the weight of public opinion regarding the poor state of the Promenade and beach at Rossall, at the other side of the cafe.

"Well, this is your chance to help to do something about it!

"We have been working with Wyre Council to address the cleanliness of the Promenade and main walk-

way and the dog warden has been working hard to address fouling and persistent offenders.

"We now turn our attention to the beach.

"Everyone is welcome – you don't have to be young, strong or fit or live on the Prom, and there will be Princes Trust volunteers and Waterfront Rangers on hand to provide the necessary muscles!"

New dog and litter bins are on order and will soon be put in place as part of the work.
